Note: If an individual commits more than one offence, the fine for each offence can be imposed.


For example, if an individual transporting a watercraft on land approaches a watercraft inspection station (a control station), proceeds directly to the station but:

- a) Fails to allow an inspection of watercraft, motor vehicle or water-related equipment (\$672) and
- b) Fails to provide assistance and information (\$672) and
- c) Fails to allow watercraft, motor vehicle or equipment to be cleaned (\$672) and
- d) Tries to leave the station without authorization (\$672)

A fine of $(\$672 \times 4=) \$2,688$ could be imposed.

Maximum fines for individuals under provision 33(4)[†] are:

- a) First offence, \$50,000 or 6 months imprisonment, or
- b) Each subsequent offence, \$100,000 or 12 months imprisonment, or both.
